Other speakers included Elaine McGhee of Greenwood Insurances who specialises in the Charity sector and Dr Danielle Kelly who is the Lead Researcher for Sheds for Sustainable Development' (SSD); a 3-year Big Lottery funded project partnership with Glasgow Caledonian

MEN'S SHED MAY BENEFIT FROM GERMAN POW LEGACY

Heinrich Steinmeyer, a German Prisoner of War who died in 2014 left a bequest of £384,000 to support older people in Comrie for the 'generosity and kindnesses' shown to him when he was a Prisoner of War interned at Cultybraggan POW Camp near Comrie, Perthshire.

A public meeting is being held after a large number of people expressed support for Comrie Community Development Trust to spend some of the Heinrich Steinmeyer Legacy Fund

on a Men's Shed.

The meeting will be held at the White Church Community Centre on **Tuesday 13th February at 19:00** for anyone who wishes to attend.

FUNDING MATTERS

Funding for Shed learning trip



Through our membership with the Scottish Community Alliance, **SMSA Member Sheds/Dev. Groups** can access funding from the **Community Learning Exchange** programme for fact finding visits to other Sheds or organisations.

The visits are for Sheds to exchange ideas and gain new insights and perspectives on shared challenges, and solutions.

What will the Exchange fund?

The Exchange will fund up to 100% of the costs of a visit up to a limit of £750, including a host fee.

How to apply

To qualify your Shed must be a fully paid up member of the SMSA. An application and full details can be found [here](#):

Once you have completed the application, forward it to admin@scottishmsa.org.uk so that we can verify your application. We will then send it on to the funders.

The good news is that the application is straightforward and we have been told that the turnaround is very quick.

Sounds like a great way to find out what's going on out there in the Scottish Shed Land! Sorry no trips to Australia :)

Applications can be made at any time for visits throughout 2018 and up until March 2019

Shed Start Up Grant Fund



The next round of funding is open for the 'Start Up' Shed funding programme administered by our partners the **Royal Voluntary Service (RVS)**, with funding from the **Asda Foundation**.

The Big change: there is just **one round** in 2018 so please make sure you submit an application by **16th March 2018**. If you were not lucky in the last round, send it in again.

Funding can be used for:

Tools and equipment, building renovation costs, revenue costs & Promotional materials

Receive "Bags of Help" from Tesco

'Bags of Help' is Tesco's local community grant scheme where the money raised from the sale of carrier bags is used to fund thousands of local projects in communities right across the UK.

How does it work?

Three community projects in **each local area** will be voted on by customers in Tesco stores, with projects changing every other month. The project that received the most votes in its area will receive a grant of up to **£4,000**, second place up to **£2,000** and third place up to **£1,000**.

How to apply

Take the '**eligibility quiz**' on their website. If you meet the basic requirements, you then get a link through to the application form. How can we sustain our Scottish Sheds?

This is the big question. A huge amount of work and effort goes in to get a Men's Shed off the ground and keep it running. Many problems are encountered along the way from finding suitable premises, recruiting members to keeping a healthy bank balance. It's not an easy task, this much we know.

Sheds for Sustainable Development (SSD) is a 3 year Big Lottery funded project in partnership with Glasgow Caledonian University and the Scottish Men's Sheds Association which will address the issue of sustainability.

The project has two main aims; firstly, to identify key development challenges and to implement action to enhance the sustainability of Sheds in Scotland and secondly, to explore the health and wellbeing impact of Shed activities on their users. From this, we are hoping to create a toolkit for sustainable development of Sheds for the future, and most importantly, **provide evidence to take to policy makers** on the impact of the fantastic work that you are all doing across Scotland.

As the lead researcher (and adopted Shedder!) I'm very keen to learn about all the amazing things that you are up to in your Sheds and to tell you more about the project. In the coming months I will be travelling around Scotland and visiting Sheds, as well as attending SMSA events and would love to talk to you, so if you see me please say hello!

Get your Shed involved

We want to pull on the wealth of knowledge that you guys have on running your own Sheds and use it for this study. **We are looking for up to six Sheds across the country to be part of the study over the full 3 year period.** If you are interested in hearing more, please contact me at danielle.kelly@gcu.ac.uk to organise an initial conversation.

I have been working with the Yunus Centre for Social Business & Health at Glasgow Caledonian University for the past 3 years focusing specifically on social businesses and enterprises that are created by the community, for the community. SHED PROJECT

Power Tool Storage and Charging Shelf

Keep your tools neatly stored and ready for action with this tidy design.

The storage unit is very simply made with either Ply, OSB or **MDF** (if you really have to) preferably either 12mm or 19mm thick. Make it to any number of specific items you need stored or charged. There's no real sizes, just whatever you want, plus a surge protected electrical extension plugged in via an RCD.

Update from Tim Green, Age Scotland

My role is to support and enable the development of Men's Sheds. Age Scotland and Men's Sheds share similar aims: providing positive views of ageing and later life; increasing health and wellbeing; and combating loneliness and isolation. Recently, I have supported the development of new Sheds in Auchterarder

(www.auchterardermenshed.btck.co.uk) and Comrie in Perth and Kinross.

Over 2017, I visited a rich and diverse range of Men's Sheds across Scotland. The 'hot issues' for most of the Sheds I've had the privilege to visit include:

1. **Proportionate health and safety.** I signpost Sheds to the SMSA online members' library.
2. **The incompatibility and onerous nature of some funding sources.** SMSA's Jason Schroeder and I will work together to inform funders about how they



can mould their funding criteria and application processes more closely to the needs and skills of Men's Sheds.

3. **The experience of the Community Empowerment (Scotland) Act 2015.**

Jason and I will be sharing, with central and local government, some of the challenges faced by Men's Sheds in utilising community assets.

I am currently in the process of filling my

WHAT'S COOKING?

This is a lovely winter warmer to get us through what's left of winter!



Cullen Skink

Serves 4

Taken from the BBC Good Food website

Ingredients

- 1 tablespoon butter
- 1 medium onion
- 2 medium potatoes, peeled and cut into 1cm cubes
- 300ml water
- 250g smoked haddock
- 250ml milk
- salt and pepper to taste
- 2 tablespoons finely chopped parsley or chives

Method

1. Melt butter in a saucepan over medium heat, then add onion and fry gently until transparent. Cook for about 5 minutes but do not allow to brown.
2. Add potatoes and water and bring to boil. Simmer for 10-15 minutes.
3. Meanwhile in another pan, cover the haddock with the milk and cook gently for about five minutes until just tender. Remove from the milk and, when cool enough to touch, flake gently into large pieces, removing bones.
4. Add milk and flaked fish to saucepan containing potatoes and other ingredients and cook for a further 5 minutes. Season with salt and pepper and sprinkle with chopped parsley.
5. Serve with crusty bread.

Employers Liability v Public Liability v Trustee Liability

Protect yourself - Trustee Liability Insurance

Covers the cost of defending a Sheds trustees against allegations of wrongdoing, (non-compliance with charity law, HSE Prosecutions etc).
